MAYOR'S UPDATE

Tinker Field

The City Council Workshop on January 27, 2014 presented a plan for Tinker Field in conjunction with the reconstruction of the Citrus Bowl. The guiding principle regarding the future of Tinker Field is an

opportunity to build a new facility that would restore a functioning baseball stadium to the area. Tinker Field is now primarily a concert venue and needs improvements to the infrastructure. The Mayor announced that he is directing staff not to move forward with the demolition of Tinker Field in order to further evaluate options. The City will continue with the plan to rebuild McCracken into a new, improved facility for our community with the ability to hold more baseball games and still serve as a concert venue. During the rebuild of McCracken, the City will work with architects to analyze Tinker Field and the existing structures to identify different ways to honor and pay tribute to the historical events that have taken place on Tinker Field.

Congratulations to Commissioner Gray

The Mayor congratulated Commissioner Jim Gray on the birth of his first grandchild who was born last week.

Neighborhood and Community Summit

The Mayor invited all residents and community-based organizations to the City of Orlando's ninth annual Mayor's Neighborhood and Community Summit on Saturday, March 1. This annual summit brings together neighborhood, arts and cultural, civic, community and faith-based leaders, and volunteers to learn and share new trends and practices for civic engagement and community building. 8th Annual Blues B-Q

Blues B-Q is back in Downtown Orlando. The free event, which attracts music fans from across the state, includes some of Orlando's best barbecue available for purchase. This year's Blues B-Q will be held on Saturday, March 1 at the corner of Garland Avenue and Central Boulevard, and will feature blues and R&B/soul singer Denise LaSalle and The Lee Boys, a funk and gospel band, as well as other national and local performers. Neighborhood Watch Awards

Last week the Mayor joined city residents, City Commissioners, and Orlando Police Chief Paul Rooney at the 29th Annual Neighborhood Watch Leader's Forum to recognize the critical role citizens play in crime prevention. This event celebrates the achievements of residents involved in neighborhood watches and who serve as neighborhood block captains. Through their efforts and along with those of OPD officers, these citizens have helped to keep Orlando safe - leading an overall 7% reduction in violent crimes, a 30% reduction in homicides and a 10% reduction in residential burglaries in 2013. The partnerships between OPD and Orlando's residents are critical in the fight against crime and keeping all neighborhoods safe. City residents are truly the "eyes and ears" in the community and the City is thankful for their involvement through programs like Neighborhood Watch.

City Energy Project

The Mayor announced that the Green Works Orlando program continues to be recognized nationally. Last month the City was selected as one of ten cities to participate in the City Energy Project, an effort that aims to create healthier, more prosperous American cities by targeting their largest source of energy use and climate pollution: commercial buildings. Other cities joining Orlando include Atlanta, Boston, Chicago, Denver, Houston, Kansas City, Los Angeles, Philadelphia and Salt Lake City.

Item B1 – Adopting a Resolution Authorizing Issuance of Contract Tourist Development Tax Payments Revenue Bonds

These bonds are a result of the Interlocal Agreement that was amended in October 2013 to allow for additional funding for the Dr. Phillips Performing Arts Center, the Citrus Bowl and funding for the construction of a new soccer stadium.

CRA Item 3 - Project DTO

At the 2013 State of Downtown Address held on October 10, recommendations from the downtown task force strategies created in 2003 were reviewed. Ten years ago, the task force created 166 recommendations for a better downtown Orlando. Today, 136 of those recommendations are complete or in progress. On today's agenda is an item that will further that initiative. Over the next twelve to fifteen months, staff will meet with the community and engage a new task force of Downtown stakeholders to envision the future of Downtown Orlando. This project will result in recommendations for a refreshed marketing strategy as well as a comprehensive re-write of the Downtown Outlook, the Community Redevelopment Area Plan.

City of Orlando General Elections

The Mayor reminded residents to get out and vote in the City's General Elections. Election Day is Tuesday, April 8, 2014. The Mayor congratulated District 1 City Commissioner Jim Gray and District 3 City Commissioner Robert F. Stuart on their unopposed re-election. There will be an election in District 5 as Commissioner Daisy W. Lynum is withdrawing from the District 5 City Commission race. There are several candidates who have qualified to run.
