MAYOR'S UPDATE

Mayor John Land and Councilman Wally Sanderlin

Last month, Apopka Mayor John Land and former Orlando City Councilman "Wally" Sanderlin passed away. Mayor Dyer opened today's meeting to honor and remember both gentlemen.

Former Apopka Mayor John Land passed away on Saturday, November 22. He was 94 and had served Apopka as its mayor for 61 years, making him the longest-serving full-time Mayor in the history of Florida.

Former City Commissioner Wally Sanderlin also passed away on Wednesday, November 26. He was Orlando's longest serving Commissioner, having served our citizens for 20 years. During his tenure, the City experienced significant growth and included several monumental moments in Orlando's history, such as the dedication of the Centennial Fountain at Lake Eola and the opening of Interstate 4 and Walt Disney World.

Mayor Dyer requested a moment of silence to honor the two distinguished public servants and to show respect and gratitude for their service. Mayor Dyer then called on District 3 Commissioner Robert F. Stuart, who represented the City at Commissioner Sanderlin's memorial service, to read the City's official Resolution presented at the service.

Mayor Dyer and City Council wished Commissioner Samuel B. Ings a happy birthday and congratulated Commissioner Robert F. Stuart on the birth of his granddaughter.
