MAYOR'S UPDATE

Blues B-Q

The City of Orlando presents the 9th annual Blues B-Q on Saturday, February 28 in Downtown Orlando at City Commons Plaza on Orange Avenue from 4:00 to 10:00 p.m. The free event includes live performances by Grammy Award winning artist Betty Wright as well as The Gerry Williams Band. This year Orlando is partnering with Pathlight Home. Pathlight Home provides more than 500 formerly homeless persons in Central Florida with permanent, supportive housing. Help support Pathlight Home by bringing any unwanted cell phones, iPods, iPads and batteries to Blues B-Q and dropping them off at the Pathlight Home tent during the event. This award was created to recognize individuals that have contributed significantly to the quality of life in Lake Eola Heights and have been advocates for the Lake Eola Heights Historic Neighborhood Association.

Agenda Items of Note

Item A-1 - Appointment of Roderick Williams as Fire Chief

Fire Chief John Miller recently announced his retirement from the Orlando Fire Department, having served 5 years as Chief and 27 years with the Orlando Fire Department. On today's agenda is the appointment of Deputy Fire Chief Roderick Williams as the new Orlando Fire Department Chief. Chief Williams has been with OFD for 19 years and is an Orlando native who graduated from Jones High School. Congratulations to Chief Miller on his retirement and to Chief Williams on his appointment.

Item B-4 - CNG Infrastructure Agreement between Peoples Gas System and City of Orlando

Also on today's agenda is an item that furthers the Green Works Orlando initiative to lead the Southeast in sustainability. One way to accomplishing that is through improvements to solid waste operations. With approval of this agenda item, the City's Solid Waste Division will launch a new fleet of compressed natural gas (CNG) commercial garbage trucks. The new trucks will benefit both Orlando residents and the environment as CNG vehicles provide fuel cost savings and also provide significant environmental benefits.

Items C-9 and C-11 - Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Resolutions

Also on today's agenda are two Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Resolutions in support of two new business headquarters in District 3: corporate/regional headquarters for Ruby Tuesday, Inc. and corporate headquarters for SMRxT, Inc. The Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program (QTI) is a tool available through the State of Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) to encourage quality job growth to targeted growth industries. This program supports the City's efforts to diversify the Orlando economy. These corporate expansions will result in a combined total of 100 new high wage, high value jobs for local residents.

Item D-2 - Memorandum of Understanding between City of Orlando and Microsoft

Also on today's agenda is an agreement with Microsoft to bring a new program - "DigiGirlz" - to middle and high school girls who attend programs in our recreation centers. DigiGirlz is a full day event where young women learn about careers in technology, connect with Microsoft employees, and participate in computer and technology workshops. The City of Orlando appreciates the partnership with Microsoft to encourage students to get excited about Science Technology Engineering Math (STEM) programs and to introduce young women to careers in technology. Item D-3 - Orlando Repertory Community Engagement Theatre Program Agreement

Last October, Orlando launched "Stand Up Orlando," a new anti-bullying campaign in partnership with the Holocaust Memorial Resource and Education Center of Florida and the Zebra Coalition®. Since the campaign began, more than 1,000 sixth grade students from Orlando's middle schools have visited the Holocaust Center and, after visiting, 95% of those students said they now understand that the Holocaust began with hateful ideas and 98% said they feel more willing to treat others with respect and stand up for those who are treated unfairly. The Zebra Coalition® is a network of organizations which provide services to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and youth ages 13-24. The Coalition assists young people facing homelessness, bullying, physical, sexual, and drug abuse, and isolation from families. Individualized programs are created to guide these young people to stability. The Zebra Coalition has provided outreach and training to more than 500 youth, parents and others in the areas of cultural competency and youth mental health first aid training. Through the Zebra Coalition, more than 450 youth are participating in art, cinema and music therapy to share personal stories about how they are overcoming various obstacles in life.

On today's agenda, Orlando is creating another partnership as part of "Stand Up Orlando." Funded through a grant with Walt Disney World, the Orlando Repertory Theatre will offer an intensive arts residency program to students at four of Orlando's community centers. Over the next three months, students will learn what it means to be part of an ensemble, explore theatre arts and learn about the role arts can play in combating bullying. At the end of the program, students will showcase what they have learned during two performances in the Rep's Universal Theatre at the end of May. Item D-4 – Orlando Community & Youth Trust Conversion of Tennis Court to Hard Court Soccer Pitch

Orlando City's inaugural game will be held on Sunday, March 8 versus Eastern Conference rivals New York City FC at the Orlando Citrus Bowl. There will be several activities the week before the game, including the Purple Pride 5K run, an evening of Soccer Under The Stars at Lake Eola Ampitheater, and a Record Breaking Pub Crawl. Council Update - Sanford Burnham Medical Research Institute

Representatives from the Sanford-Burnham Medical Research Institute gave an update on the work happening within the state-of- the-art life science facility located at Lake Nona. Dr. Dan Kelly is the founding Scientific Director for Sanford-Burnham at Lake Nona and Director of the Diabetes and Obesity Research Center and presented the update. Dr. Kelly's research focus is on Heart Disease, Cardiovascular Diseases, Cardiomyopathies, Metabolic Syndrome, Obesity, and Diabetes.
