MINUTES:

It was moved by Jay Hood and seconded by Michelle Francos to approve the May 27, 2015 Harry P. Leu Board minutes. There was no discussion. It was approved by all as presented.

ATTENDANCE AND REVENUE:

Robert Bowden reported on May 2015 Leu Attendance stating year-to-date attendance was over 7,000 visitors more than last year. Paid admissions and class attendance numbers continue to be higher compared to May 2014.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

HORTICULTURE:

Jay Hood reported from Thomas Hurst,

- The horticulture staff is working hard to keep the irrigation working overtime until a better rain pattern develops. While most of the plant material loves the hot weather, adequate watering becomes more intense. The weeds also love the hot days which increase our efforts of control.
- Several new plantings were added throughout the gardens and three large trees were removed. The removed trees, two of which were located at the front roadway, were deemed hazardous to the safety of staff and guests.
- Leu's volunteer base in the gardens continues to grow as does our intern program.
