MAYOR'S UPDATE

Happy Birthday to Commissioner Ings

Mayor Dyer congratulated Commissioner Ings on his December 13 birthday, with best wishes for a happy upcoming year, and joined all Council members in singing Happy Birthday to Commissioner Ings.

Happy Holidays

Mayor Dyer is encouraging everyone to "think local" when out doing holiday shopping this season. Make sure to patronize local businesses in the community that are part of Downtown Orlando and Orlando Main Street Districts. Helping support and strengthen the local businesses in the community provides jobs for residents and keeps more dollars in the community. Mayor Dyer expressed his hope that the winter holidays bring joy and special times to everyone, and a Happy New Year to all.

Agenda Items of Note

Item A-1 - FY 2015-2016 Mayor's Matching Grant (MMG) Cycle 1 Awards

On today's agenda is a vote to fund 26 Mayor's Matching Grant projects. Each of these projects will further enhance the City neighborhoods as well as help non-profits provide critical services to needy residents and further youth engagement and education efforts. Citizens and local volunteers will donate hundreds of hours to make these projects a reality and further impact the lives of thousands of residents

and youth throughout the City. Mayor Dyer recognized and thanked organization representatives and members of the grant selection panel that attended today's City Council meeting.

Item B-1 – Lease Agreement with Orange County for Head Start Program at Callahan Neighborhood Center

Also on today's agenda is a new lease that will help to support the City's ongoing efforts to ensure the success of our youth. The lease at the Dr. J.B. Callahan Center will allow the Head Start program to expand from 10 months to 12 months, adding service over the summer for the first time. Head Start provides children with well-balanced, nutritional meals as well as referrals for medical, dental and mental health services throughout the school year. This lease agreement will further the efforts of Orlando to be a City for everyone and is important to help families build a solid foundation for children to thrive and grow in the community while eliminating a gap in program benefits over the summer months.

Item E-1 - FY2015 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Application

Also on today's agenda is a grant application to provide funding to purchase Chest Compression Devices for the Orlando Fire Department and EMS teams. These devices will further the City's efforts to be one of the safest cities in America and further the OFD's continued commitment to excellence. During a cardiac arrest event, the act of immediate compressions is crucial and can double or even triple a victim's chance of survival. These devices are designed to increase that survivability by providing uninterrupted CPR to allow consistent blood flow to the brain. The system is lightweight, allowing the Orlando Fire Department greater accessibility to confined spaces rather than moving a patient and losing precious seconds. Through advanced technology like this and the "Take Heart Orlando" initiative, where more than 31,000 citizens have been trained in hands-only CPR, Orlando continues to keep residents and visitors safe.

Items G-1 - Copa Agreement and G-2 - Copa Host Committee Agreement

College football bowl season is here and that means the newly reconstructed Orlando Citrus Bowl will be busy. Joining the Russell Athletic Bowl and Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl for the first time this year will be the AutoNation Cure Bowl presented by Florida Hospital. With the addition of the Cure Bowl, Orlando is the only city in North America to host three bowl games annually within the same stadium. In 2016 the Citrus Bowl stadium will be filled with many exciting events and activities, including the 2016 Copa America Centenario soccer tournament. For the first time in its 100 year history, this prestigious South American championship will be staged in the United States. In June 2016, sixteen national soccer teams from South, Central and North America and the Caribbean will compete at ten venues – including the Orlando Citrus Bowl. Orlando will host at least three matches with the possibility of hosting a fourth match. Mayor Dyer thanked the City's partners at the Central Florida Sports Commission (CFSC) and Orlando City Soccer Club in helping to bring this highly popular tournament to Orlando, which is estimated to bring \$32 million in economic impact to our region.

CRA #2 – High Wage/High Value Job Creation Program Agreement between the Community Redevelopment Agency of the City of Orlando and Limbach Facility Services, LLC

Also on today's agenda is an item that will bring more high-wage/high-value jobs to the community for our residents. Through the High Wage/High Value Job Creation Program, the City is proposing funding to incentive the Limbach Facility Services to locate the corporate headquarters in Downtown Orlando. For over a century, Limbach has been an industry leader in providing sustainable building solutions and plans to create 31 new-to-Florida high-wage jobs over the next four years.

Hearings #1 - Purchase Agreement for City Sale of Lot N within Creative Village to Amelia Court at Creative Village Partners Ltd.

Also on today's agenda is a purchase agreement for a parcel at Creative Village that will make way for a new multi-family housing development. The development would have a mix of affordable and market-rate apartments and provide a new option for families looking to live near the adjacent Parramore community school. The City also continues to work with its partners at UCF and Valencia on a Downtown campus at Creative Village that would serve more than 7,000 students on its first day. All of these projects will help fulfill the vision of Creative Village as a live/work/learn and play neighborhood that accelerates Orlando's innovation-based economy and provides new opportunities for residents in Parramore.
