Orlando Solar Bears Hockey Playoffs

Mayor Dyer announced that the City's hometown hockey team - the Orlando Solar Bears - beat the Cincinnati Cyclones this past Saturday and will compete again in Game Six on Tuesday, April 29, 2014 at the Amway Center at 7 p.m. in the Eastern Conference Kelly Cup quarterfinals. The Mayor encouraged everyone to dress in Solar Bears gear and wear purple on Tuesday to show their support as the Solar Bears compete to bring a championship to Orlando.

SunRail Opening/Free Service

For more than two decades, Orlando has worked hard to bring a passenger rail system that would move residents and visitors throughout Central Florida. That vision will be realized on Wednesday, April 30, 2014 when we celebrate the grand opening of SunRail's 31-mile, 12-station first phase. The Mayor invites the entire community to join in the celebrating of this momentous occasion by attending one of several grand opening events. The grand opening main event will be held at the Sand Lake Road station (8030 South Orange Avenue) from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Wednesday, April 30. The program will feature several elected officials and other state and federal dignitaries who helped to make SunRail a reality.

- From 10:10 to 11:00 a.m., join Commissioner Samuel B. Ings in celebrating the train at Church Street Station.
- From 10:40 to 11:10 a.m., join Commissioner Sheehan in welcoming the train to the Orlando Health Station.

Agenda Items of Note

Item I-2 - Best Foot Forward for Pedestrian Safety

On today's agenda is a funding agreement for the Best Foot Forward program. As our region continues to embrace alternative modes of transportation it is important to support programs that are focused on preventing pedestrian deaths and injuries in our community. Since the Best Foot Forward program launched in 2012, the City has seen remarkable positive results, such as nearly 1700 warnings issued for drivers failing to yield to pedestrians at targeted intersections, nearly 411 citations to drivers for violating the yield law at targeted intersections, and compliance with the Best Foot Forward yield rate rising from 9% at the beginning of the program to an average of 48% currently. Most importantly, though pedestrian awareness behavior is changing as a result Best Foot Forward, everyone can to continue to focus on yielding to pedestrians and joining in this mission to prevent accidents and improve safety while encouraging walking as a safe and fun form of transportation and healthy activity.

Item B-1 - Orlando Ballet Lease

Also on today's agenda is a proposed lease agreement between the Orlando Ballet and the Loch Haven Community Center. By leasing at the Loch Haven Community Center, the Ballet will contribute to the preservation of the existing building as well as enhance the building with renovations, while continuing to utilize the space available with other groups. The Ballet plans to further invest in the area by incorporating an expansion that will create a permanent home for this non-touring resident art and cultural asset, one of only two of Orlando's resident art companies that will perform regularly at the soon to open

Dr. Phillips Center for Performing Arts. Partnerships like this continue to bring arts and culture in Orlando to the next level and benefit the entire Central Florida region. The Mayor recognized Commissioner Robert F. Stuart for his involvement and leadership on this issue.

Item C-9 – Antech Diagnostics Qualified Tax Industry Tax Refund Resolution

Also on today's agenda is an approval of a Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Resolution supporting the expansion of Antech Diagnostics into Orlando. Antech Diagnostics provides veterinary diagnostic testing services to more than 19,000 animal hospitals throughout North America and has plans to develop its Southeast regional headquarters into Orlando. As a result of this incentive Antech Diagnostics will create 45 new high-wage, high-value jobs in Orlando.
