Ordinance No. 2014-46

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 18A (PARKS AND OUTDOOR PUBLIC ASSEMBLIES) OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO BY AMENDING SECTIONS 18A.01, 18A.03 AND 18A.08 TO UPDATE NAMES AND TITLES; BY AMENDING SECTIONS 18A.02 AND 18A.06 TO UPDATE THE LISTING OF CITY PARKS AND THEIR HOURS; BY AMENDING SECTION 18A.09 TO REVISE THE LISTING OF PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES IN PARKS; BY AMENDING SECTION 18A.10 TO PROVIDE FOR AN EXCEPTION TO THE 18A PERMITTING PROCESS IF A CITY COUNCIL APPROVED CONTRACT HAS ADDRESSED THE SAME ISSUES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA:

SECTION ONE: Section 18A.01 of Chapter 18A of the Code of the City of Orlando, is hereby amended to read as follows:

- Sec. 18A.01. Definitions.
- The following terms, when used in this Chapter shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section:
- (1) Advertise is the act of publicly announcing or calling public attention to a person, thing, place or event and shall include, but not be limited to, the distribution of handbills or mass mailings, the use of outdoor advertising and announcements by radio, television, or newspaper.
- (2) At-large shall mean: a dog or exotic pet off the owner's premises and not under a competent person's control by means of a leash, cord or chain.
- (3) Bicycle Path is defined as a public way intended primarily for bicyclists, at the side of a street or in or through a public park or other public property.

- (34) Chief of Police is the Chief of Police of the City of Orlando, Florida, or his/her designee.
- (4<u>5</u>) <u>Executive</u> Director of OrlandoVenues <u>Orlando Venues</u> is the Director of the Orlando Venues Department of the City of Orlando, Florida, or his/her designee.
- (56) Director of Families, Parks and Recreation is the Director of the Families, Parks and Recreation Department of the City of Orlando, Florida, or his/her_designee.
- (67) Director of Public Works is the Director of Public Works of the City of Orlando, Florida, or his/her designee.
- (78) Executive Director is the Executive Director of the Community Redevelopment Agency of the City of Orlando, Florida, and the Downtown Development Board of the City of Orlando or his/her designee.
- (89) Hardscape is defined as an improved sidewalk surface area, including, but not limited to, concrete, brick, pavers, tile, or other masonry materials.
- (109) Hardscape Furnishings is defined as rigid objects or fixtures located within a hardscape, including, but not limited to, lamp posts, benches, trash receptacles, tree grates, tree guards, utility boxes, traffic equipment cabinets, traffic signal poles, pay phones, phone booths, flower pots, planters, mail boxes, newspaper dispensers, parking meters, hitching posts, bollards, and signs.
- (101) Landscape is defined as an improved area of ground specifically intended to grow various plant materials, which may consist of turf, lawn, grass, trees, tree wells, shrubs, hedges, flowers, flowering plants (annuals and perennials), planter beds, planter pots, planter bowls, hanging baskets, and all plant materials contained therein.
- (142) Outdoor Public Assembly (also referred to herein as assembly) is any celebration, gathering, ceremony, show, exhibition, concert, pageant, rally, demonstration, or assembly of any kind, which is, (a) calculated to attract at any one time the physical attendance or attention of over one hundred (100) persons, and (b) is held in or on any street, sidewalk, or right of way,

 or is held on other property which impacts adjacent streets, sidewalks, or rights of way to the extent that closure is necessary in order to assure the safety of vehicular and/or pedestrian movement in the area. In addition, any parade as defined herein shall be considered an outdoor public assembly.

- (123) Outdoor Public Assembly Permit (also referred to herein as permit) is a permit as required by this Chapter.
- (134) Parade is any procession, march or assembly wherein the participants travel by foot, vehicle or otherwise in or upon any street, sidewalk, public right-of-way, bicycle path, public property, or public parking facility within the City; provided, however, that "parade" shall not include a peaceful procession or peaceful picketing that is conducted off the street or roadway in conformance with all traffic laws, city ordinances and state statutes and not in a manner as to obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic.
- (14<u>5</u>) Parks are those areas listed in <u>Sections 18A.02 and 18A.07</u> and any other areas officially designated by City Council as a park and posted as such.
- (156) Park Facilities are any improvements or structures, either natural or artificial, including but not limited to the <u>Lake</u> Eola Park <u>Band Shell Amphitheater</u>, and any other buildings, shelters, benches, tables, playground equipment, bird feeders, walls, fences, fountains, walkways, toilet facilities, and signs located in, upon or around a park.
- (167) Park Grounds are the real property upon which parks are located and any and all trees, shrubbery, flowers, leaves, grasses, plants, fruit, mushrooms, toadstools, dirt and rocks located above, on or under said property.
- (178) Person is any individual person, or any firm, partnership, association, corporation, company or organization of any kind, or any combination of such persons.
- (189) Public Use is any lawful utilization of park grounds and facilities which is not prohibited by any applicable regulation, ordinance, or law and which does not in fact interfere with, or tend

to interfere with or obstruct the use of the park grounds or facilities by the general public or by any other person or person previously authorized to utilize the same.

(2019) Sidewalk is any area or way set aside or open to the general public for purposes of

(2019) Sidewalk is any area or way set aside or open to the general public for purposes of pedestrian traffic, whether or not it is paved.

(29<u>1</u>) Street is any place or way set aside or open to the general public for purposes of vehicular traffic, including any berm or shoulder parkway, right-of-way, or median strip thereof.

(24<u>2</u>) Sunrise is the time of day designated as sunrise by the Nautical Almanac Office, United States Naval Observatory, Washington, D.C.

(223) Sunset is the time of day designated as sunset by the Nautical Almanac Office, United States Naval Observatory, Washington, D.C.

(234) Large Group Feeding is defined as an event intended to attract, attracting, or likely to attract twenty-five (25) or more people, including distributors and servers, in a park or park facility owned or controlled by the City, including adjacent sidewalks and rights-of-way in the GDPD, for the delivery or service of food. Excluded from this definition are activities of City licensed or contracted concessionaires, lessees, or licensees.

(24<u>5</u>) Greater Orlando Park District (GDPD) is defined as an area within the limits of the City of Orlando, Florida, extending out a two (2) mile radius in all directions from City Hall and including all of the parks and park facilities owned or controlled by the City touched by that radius, in their entirety.

SECTION TWO: Section 18A.02 of Chapter 18A of the Code of the City of Orlando, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18A.02. Parks and Facilities; Closing Hours; Presence After Closing Hours Prohibited.

(1) The following City of Orlando Parks shall be open for public use between the hours of 6:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. of the same day and shall be closed to public use from 11:00 p.m.

hours may be modified upon approval or permit granted by City Council, the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation or the Chief of Police.

- (7) Michael McCoy Park shall be open for public use between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and sunset of the same day on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays, Mondays and all public school holidays and 3:00 p.m. until sunset of the same day on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, unless otherwise approved or permitted and posted by City Council, the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation or the Chief of Police.
- _(86) Cady Way Trail and Lake Fran Bike Trail shall be open for public use from sunrise until sunset of the same day and shall be closed to public use from sunset until sunrise, unless otherwise approved or permitted and posted by City Council, the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation or the Chief of Police.
- (9) Orlando Skate Park shall be open for public use in accordance with the hours of operation posted at the park, unless otherwise approved, permitted and posted by City Council, or the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation or the Chief of Police.
- (407) Eagles Nest Conservation Area shall not be open for public use unless advance written permission has been granted and a City staff escort has been arranged with the Director of the Families, Parks and Recreation Department or the Wastewater Division Manager.
- (418) Dubsdread Golf Course shall be open to the public at posted hours for golf only and shall not otherwise be open for public use unless otherwise approved by the City Council or by the City's Director of Families, Parks and Recreation Chief Financial Officer. The public must register at the Dubsdread Club House and pay applicable fees before using the Dubsdread Golf Course.
- (9) Orlando Wetlands Park shall be open for public use from sunrise until sunset of the same day and shall be closed to public use from sunset until sunrise; and shall be closed to public use from November 15 through January 31 of each calendar year unless otherwise

approved or permitted and posted by City Council, the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation, the Director of Public Works or the Chief of Police.

(11) Bill Frederick Park at Turkey Lake shall be open for public use between the hours of 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. of the same day and shall be closed to public use from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 a.m. of the following day from November 1 through March 31 of each calendar year; and shall be open for public use from 8:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. of the same day and shall be closed to public use from 7:00 p.m. until 8:00 a.m. of the following day from April 1 through October 31 of each calendar year unless otherwise approved or permitted and posted by City Council, the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation or the Chief of Police.

(12) The following City of Orlando Parks shall be open for public use from 9:00 a.m. until one-half hour prior to sunset of the same day and shall be closed to public use from one-half hour prior to sunset until 9:00 a.m. of the following day unless otherwise approved or permitted and posted by City Council, the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation or the Chief of Police:

Lake Druid Park;

Springdale Green.

- (13) Z.L. Riley Park shall be open for public use from 8 a.m. until one-half hour prior to sunset of the same day and shall be closed to public use from one-half hour prior to sunset until 8 a.m. of the following day unless otherwise approved or permitted and posted by City Council, the Director of the Families, Parks and Recreation.
- (13) It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully enter upon or remain within any of the parks listed above during such hours as the parks are closed to public use. Such presence shall be grounds for immediate arrest.

SECTION THREE: Section 18A.03 of Chapter 18A of the Code of the City of Orlando, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18A.03. - City Commons Plaza and <u>Lake</u> Eola Park; Hours of Operation; Presence After Closing Prohibited.

- (1) City Commons Plaza and Lake Eola Park are City of Orlando parks which shall be open for public use each day from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 midnight and shall be closed for public use each day between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. Such closing hours shall not apply to activities being held pursuant to approval City policy or permit granted by City Council as to City Commons Plaza or by City Council, the City's Director of Families, Parks and Recreation or Chief of Police as to Lake Eola Park when such approval or permit specifies longer hours.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully enter upon or remain within the plaza at City Commons Plaza or <u>Lake</u> Eola Park during such hours as these parks are closed for public use. Such presence shall be grounds for immediate arrest.

SECTION FOUR: Section 18A.06 of Chapter 18A of the Code of the City of Orlando, is hereby amended to read as follows:

- Sec. 18A.06. Park of the Americas.
- (1) Park of the Americas shall be open for public use from 8:00 a.m. until half an hour before sunset of the same day and shall be closed to public use from half an hour before sunset until 8:00 a.m. of the following day, unless otherwise approved or permitted and posted by the City Council or the City's Director of Families, Parks and Recreation or the Chief of Police is a City of Orlando park for which the Families, Parks and Recreation Department will provide guided tours, by appointment, for community and school groups interested in learning about the unique Florida natural plant species at the park. Park of the Americas will be open for use by the general public on Saturdays and Sundays between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully enter upon or remain within the Park of the Americas during such hours as the park is closed for public use. Such presence shall be grounds for immediate arrest.

SECTION FIVE: Section 18A.08 of Chapter 18A of the Code of the City of Orlando, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18A.08. - Posting of Park Closing Hours.

The Director of Families, Parks and Recreation_or the Director of Public Works shall prepare, install and maintain a sign or signs in each park which has closing hours, and each sign shall recite the closing hours of the particular park. Each sign shall be displayed prominently in the park, in a manner calculated to give notice to the general public of the closing hours of the park.

SECTION SIX: Section 18A.09 of Chapter 18A of the Code of the City of Orlando, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18A.09. - Prohibited Activities in Parks and Recreational Facilities Owned or Controlled by the City.

Except for activities of a governmental agency within the scope of its governmental authority, or unless specifically permitted to do so by a permit or approval issued pursuant to this Chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person to do any one or more of the following in a park or recreational facility owned or controlled by the City:

- (a) Lie or otherwise be in a horizontal position on a park bench, table or where prohibited by signs.
 - (b) Sleep at any time during the hours from sunset to sunrise of the following day.
 - (c) Sleep or otherwise be or remain in any bushes, shrubs, or other foliage..
 - (d) Construct any hut, shanty, or other shelter.
- (de) Cook foodstuffs except where facilities for such preparations are provided by the City.
 - (ef) Set or stoke a fire except where appropriate facilities are provided by the City.
- (fg) Discharge or deposit human wastes, except in toilet facilities provided by the City.

- (gh) <u>Drive stakes or posts</u>, <u>Ddig</u> holes or otherwise <u>penetrate or disturb</u> the natural surface of the ground, <u>but Where applicable</u>, <u>weights maywill be used to secure tents or inflatable devices</u>.
- (hi) Pick flowers or damage or remove plants, trees, shrubs, or any part of the park grounds.
- (i) Erect signs or affix signs to any tree, <u>light pole</u>, <u>existing park sign</u>, post or park facility or grounds, except signs posted by the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation pursuant to Sections 18A.08 and 18A.09.
- (jk) Drive, putt or otherwise hit a golf ball or shoot an arrow, except in areas specifically designated for those purposes by signs erected by the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation.
- (kl) Kill, injure, harm, capture, chase, poison, or remove any wildlife, animal, bird, or touch, break, remove, or relocate any <u>animal bird or egg</u> located above, upon or under park grounds.
- (<u>lm</u>) Write on, draw on, or otherwise deface, damage, remove or destroy any park facility or any part of the park grounds.
- (mn) Operate any motor vehicle <u>capable of speeds equal to or greater than 4 mph</u> as defined in Chapter 39 of this Code except for the operation of golf carts at Dubsdread Golf Course in compliance with rules and regulations established by that facility.
- (<u>no</u>) Purchase, sell, offer for sale, possess or consume any alcoholic beverages as defined by the laws of Florida except as permitted under Section 33.03 or 33.06 of this Code.
- (o)—Sleep or otherwise be or remain in any bushes, shrubs, or other foliage where prohibited by signs.

- (p) Use public restrooms to shave, <u>bathe</u>, <u>shampoo hair</u> and/or shower <u>and/or wash</u> <u>clothes</u>; provided, however, that showering is permitted where shower facilities are specifically provided for public use.
- (q) Sit <u>or stand</u> in or on any trash receptacles, <u>light fixtures</u>, <u>fences</u>, <u>railings</u>, <u>pavilions</u>, planters, or newspaper dispensers provided for public use.
- (r) Use roller skates, inline skates, scooters or skateboards except in areas specifically designated for those purposes by signs erected by the Director of Families, Parks and Recreation.
 - (s) Bathe or otherwise be or remain in a water fountain and/or reservoir.
- (t) To stop, stand, or park any motor vehicle or trailer as defined in Chapter 39 of this Code in an area not specifically designated for parking.
- (u) To erect inflatables of any size or tents over 15' x 15' or any size tent with more than three walls unless permitted as provided by a facility use permit and under Section 18.01 of this Code as applicable.
- (v) No domestic dog or exotic pet owner or person having charge, care, custody or control of any dog or exotic pet shall permit, any such animal to be at large, upon any public property (except in the case of dogs for City established and approved off-leash dog parks).

 Provided however, no domestic dog or exotic pet shall be allowed onto any City athletic field.
- (w) To fail to remove any excreta deposited upon public property including City parks, recreational facilities, sidewalks, and right-of-ways by any animal within the care, custody, ownership, or control of such person.

SECTION SEVEN: Section 18A.10 of Chapter 18A of the Code of the City of Orlando, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18A.10. - Permits and Authorizations Required.

- (1) No person shall advertise, engage in, participate in, aid, form or start any outdoor public assembly unless an outdoor public assembly permit shall first have been obtained from the Chief of Police.
- The issuance of an outdoor public assembly permit from the Chief of Police shall not relieve any person from the duty to secure other permits or approvals as may be required by the City Code to include, but not be limited to, a tent permit (under City Code Chapter 18), an occupational license (under City Code Chapter 36), street, lane or sidewalk use/closure authorization (under City Code Chapter 39), a permit for loud speaker or other sound amplification device (under City Code Chapter 42), and City Council approval for sale of items on public property (under City Code Chapter 54).
- (3) Exceptions. This section shall not apply to, nor shall a permit be required for funeral processions or for events authorized at the Florida Citrus Bowl and Tinker Field. Additionally, City Council may specifically exempt persons, organizations or assemblies from the requirements of this section, provided that alternate procedures providing for the protections addressed by this Chapter are included in a separate agreement approved by City Council.

SECTION EIGHT: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid, or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereto:

SECTION NINE: This ordinance shall take effect ten days after its passage.
