# City's Fleet Operation Receives "Top 100" Recognition

Orlando's Fleet and Facilities Management Division provide preventative maintenance to City vehicles, buildings and equipment. The Fleet Division is proud to announce its inclusion for the third year in a row as one of the "Top 100" Best Fleets in North America. This recognition promotes pride in the industry, promotes productivity and operational effectiveness, and encourages individuals to consider fleet operations as a career choice. Orlando ranks 46<sup>th</sup> in the "Top 100," ranks 23<sup>rd</sup> in the Leading Fleet award and 19<sup>th</sup> in the Green Fleet award. Mayor Dyer congratulated the Fleet Division for its hard work and excellence in serving the City and its residents.

#### **Orlando Fire Department Recognition**

Mayor Dyer introduced and congratulated Lt. John Jockin of the Orlando Fire Department for being awarded "Florida Fire Investigator of the Year - Arson/Bomb Squad" by the Florida Fire Marshals and Inspectors Association. Lt. Jockin has been a firefighter with the Orlando Fire Department for eleven years and an Arson/Bomb Squad Investigator for the past two years. During this time he has been instrumental in solving several arson fires, has handled EOD Suspicious Packages, initiated special projects, investigated Internal Affairs cases, trained fellow firefighters and police officers, and attended numerous training classes. Mayor Dyer thanked Lt. Jockin for his dedication and service.

# "Stand Up Orlando" Anti-Bullying Campaign

On October 23, Mayor Dyer joined students from the City's After-School All-Stars program and several community partners to announce a new anti-bullying initiative: Stand Up Orlando. Stand Up Orlando is a partnership between the Holocaust Center, Zebra Coalition and Orlando Police Department to provide year-round education to students in Orlando's public middle schools, to hire an outreach coordinator to train adults, and to increase awareness throughout our entire community. With one in four students reporting being bullied sometime during the school year, Stand Up Orlando aims to encourage everyone in the community to make a commitment to stand up and speak out when they witness someone being bullied or mistreated. # CRA #4 - Local Match Funding for StarterCorps

On today's CRA agenda is a commitment to provide \$100,000 in local match funds for a U.S. Economic Development Administration grant application to create "StarterCorps." A partnership between UCF, Downtown's Canvs, and Starter Studio, StarterCorps will be a non-profit evergreen fund that will provide urgently needed seed-stage capital for technology startups to grow into sustainable companies. If the grant is awarded, proceeds from the grant would be used to incorporate and launch the fund and to implement an intensive three month mentoring program through Starter Studio, which is located at Canvs in the Church Street Exchange Building. An evergreen seed fund like StarterCorps is the missing link in Downtown Orlando's technology ecosystem and will provide critical capital to Orlando's most promising tech startups, which are the foundation of every innovation-based economy in the world.

# Item C-2 - staySky Vacation Club Qualified Target Industry Tax Fund

Also on today's agenda is the consideration of a Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Resolution supporting the development of staySky Vacation Club's international headquarters in the City of Orlando. This company is a new business venture by Sky Resort Management which is currently headquartered in Orlando. If this incentive is approved, the corporate expansion will result in 88 new high wage-high value jobs for local residents.

Mayor Dyer opened discussion on Ordinance No. 2014-42 (Growth Management Plan). Commissioner Robert F. Stuart called the question and vote carried 4-1, with Commissioner Patty Sheehan voting No (and Commissioner Tony Ortiz no longer participating by phone), that the Ordinance be adopted on 2<sup>nd</sup> reading. The Ordinance was adopted by a **4-1** vote. Filed and documentary **#1411031205**;
