Mayor Dyer congratulated Orlando Police Department Chief John Mina on being named one of *Orlando Business Journal's* 2015 Veterans of Influence. Chief Mina is a veteran, having served in the U.S. Army. Chief Mina took office last year in 2014 and set a goal to hire as many veterans as possible. 29 veterans have been hired as Orlando police officers since April 1, 2014, which is approximately 40% of all hires during that time frame. Mayor Dyer thanked Chief Mina for his Army service and for helping Orlando to further its commitment to veterans in our community.

20th Anniversary of Mayor's Matching Grant Program

Last week Orlando marked a milestone as the Mayor's Matching Grant project team leaders joined to celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the Mayor's Matching Grant program. Commissioner Robert F. Stuart joined Mayor Dyer and City staff to honor the MMG's dedicated project leaders. This citizen engagement program began in 1995 and has engaged more than 50,000 residents and served more than 137,000 youth. Amway Center Five Year Anniversary

On October 1, the City celebrated the five year anniversary of the Amway Center. The arena has hosted more than 6.6 million guests and bolstered Orlando's economic vitality by creating jobs, keeping local restaurants and bars bustling and drawing both residents and tourists to Downtown Orlando. In the past five years the Amway Center has hosted numerous high-profile sporting events like the NBA All-Star Weekend, NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championships, ECHL All-Star Classic and World Championship Boxing while also welcoming the biggest names in entertainment including Taylor Swift,

Paul McCartney, Justin Timberlake, The Eagles and Kevin Hart. The Amway Center has won numerous awards ranging from the *Sports Business Journal's* "Sports Facility of the Year" to the Stadium Business Awards "Customer Experience Award" and received the number one ranking in the NBA for achievement of the ELEVATE standards during the 2014/15 season.

Agenda Items of Note

Funding Agreements

On today's agenda are several funding agreements that will allow the City to provide funding for community service organizations, arts and cultural organizations and housing assistance organizations, many which are funded through the CRP process and through HUD grants. Mayor Dyer recognized participants attending today's council meeting and thanked them for their service and partnership with Orlando.

Items B-1, B-2 and B-3 – Bike Share

Also on today's agenda are items that will further the efforts of the City to provide multi-modal forms transportation for residents and visitors. Part of this effort includes the City's commitment to investing i biking amenities. Currently, Orlando is home to more than 300 miles of urban bicycling trails, signed routes and lanes and is a designated Bicycle Friendly Community since 2000. With the expansion of the City's Bike Share Program, eight new stations will be added throughout Downtown. To date, bike share users have traveled nearly 20,000 miles - the equivalent of one person riding a bike round trip from Orlando to Australia.

Item B-6 – Award to NorthStar Demolition and Remediation, LP for Demolition of City Properties

Earlier this year, Orlando purchased seven vacant foreclosed properties in the greater Washington Shores area and Mercy Drive in an effort to transform the sites into safe and attractive housing for residents. Two of the properties have been sold and the City's partners at Lift Orlando will be working to redevelop the sites in Washington Shores. On today's agenda is an action to have the other five properties demolished. Demolition of these multi-family properties is the next step in continuing to make the neighborhood safe, clean and suitable for redevelopment. The City is also currently reviewing proposals for redevelopment of three of the remaining sites.

Item C-1 – Renewal of Orlando Main Street District Agreements for FY2015/2016

Also on today's agenda, the City will renew its annual Orlando Main Street program agreements with the Audubon Park Garden District, College Park Partnership, Downtown South, Ivanhoe Village, Mills50, Church Street District, Gateway Orlando, Thornton Park District and the Orlando Tech Association. Since 2008, the Main Street program has resulted in an average public/private investment of more than \$260 million dollars. Main Street districts have grown to include 600 new businesses and the addition of more than 4,000 full and part time jobs to the local economy. Mayor Dyer congratulated all of the Main Street districts for attracting great businesses to strong neighborhood commercial districts throughout the City.

Item F-2 – FY 2015-2016 HUD-Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Rapid Re-housing agreement between the City of Orlando and Harbor House of Central Florida, Inc.

During the month of October, Orlando will join with cities across the country to raise awareness about domestic violence and renew its focus on ending domestic violence in the community. To further support these efforts, on today's agenda for approval is \$100,000 in grant funding to the Harbor House of Central Florida, Inc. This funding will help to continue to connect victims in the community with vital services and resources and to prevent reoccurrences of domestic violence incidents. Last week, the City announced another new program with Harbor House wherein the Orlando Police Department will begin using a dedicated domestic violence hotline which directly connects to a domestic violence advocate, putting victims on the phone with an advocate right away. Through partnerships like this, Orlando continues to make great strides in moving the needle on domestic violence by making residents safer and, in some cases, saving lives.
