AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, RELATING TO **STORMWATER REQUIREMENTS;** AMENDING CHAPTERS 63 AND 65, ORLANDO CITY CODE TO CLARIFY SPECIFIC FREEBOARD, WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT, AND STORM EVENT **REQUIREMENTS;** PROVIDING DURATION FOR SEVERABILITY. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING **ORDINANCES** AND ACTIONS, **CODIFICATION**, CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, AND AN **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, section 163.3202(1), Florida Statutes, requires that the City of Orlando, Florida (the "City") adopt or amend and enforce land development regulations that are consistent with and implement the City's adopted comprehensive plan; and

WHEREAS, from time to time, amendments and revisions to the City's adopted comprehensive plan (the "Growth Management Plan") and progress in the field of planning and zoning make it necessary or desirable to amend or revise the land development regulations of the City; and

WHEREAS, at its regularly scheduled meeting of January 19, 2016, the Municipal Planning Board (MPB) considered proposed changes to the land development code related to the City's Engineering Standards Manual (LDC2015-00503), and recommended approval of these changes; and that the provisions of this ordinance are consistent with the applicable provisions of the City's adopted Growth Management Plan, are in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare, are in harmony with the purpose and intent of the City's Land Development Code, will not result in disorderly and illogical development patterns, and will not result in incompatible land uses; and

WHEREAS, the Orlando City Council hereby finds and determines that this ordinance is consistent with the applicable provisions of the City's adopted Growth Management Plan, is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare, is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the City's Land Development Code, will not result in disorderly and illogical development patterns, and will not result in incompatible land uses; and

WHEREAS, the Orlando City Council hereby finds and declares that amending the City's current land development regulations relating to stormwater requirements, as provided in this ordinance, will appropriately regulate the City's freeboard, water management district and storm event duration requirements and are consistent with the Engineering Standards Manual and Florida Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. CHAPTER 63, AMENDED. Chapter 63 of the Code of the City of Orlando, Florida, is hereby amended as follows:
