## **MINUTES:**

It was moved by Michael Provenzale and seconded by Camara Williams to approve the March 23, 2016 Harry P. Leu Board minutes. There was no discussion. It was approved by all as presented.

## ATTENDANCE, REVENUE AND EXPENSE REPORTS:

Robert Bowden reported on March 2016 Leu Attendance and noted that attendance is 11,000 ahead of last year's numbers with paid admissions 6,800 more than last year.

It was moved by Camara Williams and seconded by Jennifer Lombardo to approve Leu's March 2016 Attendance reports. There was no discussion. It was approved by all as presented.

Mr. Bowden reviewed the March 2016 Revenue and Expense Reports with the Board noting increases in most departments. Discussion ensued on operational and budgeted expenses.

## Tours:

March 2016 - 28 tours, 974 people, March 2015 - 14 tours, 433 people

Tours were busy in March and April especially the Big Bug tours. In March we had 15 bug tours with 620 children even though all schools had spring break in March, we did well. Several schools, mostly private had never been to the gardens before, we hope the gardens become an annual visit with the great responses from teachers and students.

March 2016 - 12 classes, 170 attending (2 cancelled), March 2015 – 13 classes, 154 attending (4 classes cancelled) In conjunction with the Big Bugs exhibit we offered 14 (7 adults, 3 children, 4 family) insect-related classes January thru April.

Mr. Bowden shared the City's Stormwater department future plans to install a new drainage system at the Gardens.
