AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, VACATING, CLOSING, AND ABANDONING SEGMENTS OF MICHIGAN AVENUE, OHIO STREET, AND HARMON AVE., EACH SEGMENT BEING AT OR NEAR THE CALVARY ASSEMBLY OF GOD CHURCH GENERALLY LOCATED NORTH OF DARTMOUTH AVE., EAST OF INTERSTATE 4, SOUTH OF MINNESOTA AVE., AND WEST OF CLAY ST., AND TOGETHER COMPRISED OF APPROXIMATELY 1.6 ACRES OF LAND, MORE OR LESS; PROVIDING FOR THE EXECUTION OF EFFECTING DOCUMENTS, SEVERABILITY, CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, at its regularly scheduled meeting of June 16, 2015, the Municipal Planning Board (the "MPB") of the City of Orlando, Florida (the "city"), considered an application (City of Orlando case number ABN2015-00001) for the abandonment of approximately 1.6 acres of right-of-way comprising (1) a segment of Michigan Avenue, generally located north of Harmon Avenue, east of Interstate 4, south of Minnesota Avenue, and west of Clay Street (by itself comprising approximately 0.75 acres of land, being more precisely identified by the metes and bounds description and depicted by the sketch of description attached to this ordinance as Exhibit A, page 2 of 4); (2) a segment of Ohio Street, generally located north of Michigan Avenue, east of Interstate 4, south of Minnesota Avenue, and west of Clay Street (by itself comprising approximately 0.32 acres of land, being more precisely identified by the metes and bounds description and depicted by the sketch of description attached to this ordinance as Exhibit A, page 3 of 4); and (3) a segment of Harmon Avenue, generally located north of Jewell Avenue, east of Interstate 4, south of Minnesota Avenue, and west of Clay Street (by itself comprising approximately 0.20 acres of land, being more precisely identified by the metes and bounds description and depicted by the sketch of description attached to this ordinance as Exhibit A, page 4 of 4), all together being referred to herein as the "property"; and

 WHEREAS, based upon the evidence presented to the MPB, including the information and analysis contained in the "Staff Report to the Municipal Planning Board" for abandonment application case number ABN2015-00001 (entitled "Item #1 – Ohio St., Michigan Ave. & Part of Harmon Ave. R-O-W Abandonments" and hereinafter referred to as the "staff report"), and subject to certain conditions, the MPB recommended that the City Council of the City of Orlando, Florida (the "Orlando City Council"), approve the abandonment application and adopt an ordinance in accordance therewith; and

WHEREAS, the MPB found that the abandonment application is consistent with:

- The City of Orlando Growth Management Plan, adopted as the City's "comprehensive plan" for purposes of the Florida Community Planning Act, sections 163.3164 through 163.3217, Florida Statutes (the "GMP"); and
- 2. The City of Orlando Land Development Code, Chapters 58 through 68, Code of the City of Orlando, Florida (the "LDC"); and

WHEREAS, the Orlando City Council hereby finds that this ordinance is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare, and is consistent with the applicable provisions of the City's GMP and LDC; and

WHEREAS, the Orlando City Council hereby finds and determines that the property is no longer useful and needed for public right-of-way and that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare that it be vacated, closed, and abandoned as public right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the property is wholly located in Orange County, Florida, and within the jurisdiction of the city; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. ABANDONMENT. The property is hereby vacated, closed, and abandoned as public right-of-way. All right, title, and interest in the property as the city may hold shall revert to those with interests as provided by law.

SECTION 2. EFFECTING DOCUMENTS. The mayor, city clerk, and city attorney are hereby authorized and directed to execute such instruments as may be necessary or convenient to implement this ordinance.

SECTION 3. SCRIVENER'S ERROR. The city attorney may correct scrivener's errors found in this ordinance by filing a corrected copy of this ordinance with the city clerk.
