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AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, RELATING TO MICRO-DISTILLERIES. BREWERIES. CRAFT MICRO-WINERIES, AND BREWPUBS; AMENDING SECTION 58.913, ORLANDO CITY CODE, CREATING SPECIFIC ACCESSORY SERVICE USE STANDARDS MICRO-BREWERIES, CRAFT DISTILLERIES, MICRO-WINERIES AND BREWPUBS; AMENDING CHAPTER 66, ORLANDO CITY CODE, DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS, AND FOR SEVERABILITY, CORRECTION CODIFICATION, OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS,** there is a revival in "micro", breweries, wineries, and distilleries nationwide; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Orlando, Florida (the "Orlando City Council"), has determined that it is desirable and in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare to amend the Land Development Code of the City of Orlando (the "LDC"), to encourage and promote such business activities in the City of Orlando; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City can encourage and promote such business activities by allowing such business to operate as a Specific Accessory Service Use; and

**WHEREAS**, the LDC currently allows an accessory service use to occupy up to 25% of the floor area of the building; and

**WHEREAS**, micro-breweries, micro-wineries, and craft distilleries may need to allocate up to 50% of their floor area to sustain production; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1. SEC. 58.913.** Section 58.913, Code of the City of Orlando, Florida, is hereby amended as follows:

# Sec. 58.913. – Specific Accessory Service Uses.

Eating and Drinking Establishments. Eating and drinking establishments shall be permitted as accessory service uses in the IP (Industrial Park) district only if the establishment is located internally within the building site and is not located on a major thoroughfare. These establishments shall be considered under the Conditional Use provision of this Code.

86	6) Classification of Use. For purposes of Figure 3, Chapter 58, Orlando City

89	a brewpub that has a restaurant use and a craft brewing operation in a
90	commercial zoning district where the use devotes the greatest amount of
91	space to a restaurant will be classified as a restaurant).
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93	Notwithstanding any other provision of this Code, the following uses are hereby
94	prohibited as accessory service uses:
95	Adult Entertainment Establishments, Body Scrub Facilities, Commercial Physical
96	Contact Establishments, Escort Services, Fortune Telling/Psychic Service
97	Establishments, Health Spas, Massage Establishments, Modeling Centers, Pawn
98	Shops, Tattoo Parlors/Body Art Shops, Temporary Labor Facilities, and Pain
99	Management Clinics.
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101	SECTION 2. Part 2, Chapter 66, Code of the City of Orlando, Florida, is hereby
102	amended as follows:
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104	Brewpub: A restaurant that is licensed by the Florida Department of Business
105	and Professional Regulation, Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco to produce
106	malt beverages for onsite consumption.

108	Craft Distillery: An establishment that is licensed by the Florida Department of
109	Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco to
110	produce distilled spirits. The establishment may also include a tasting room and retail
111 112	space to sell spirits produced on the premises along with related retail items and food.
112	Micro-Brewery: An establishment that is licensed by the Florida Department of
114	Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco to
115	manufacture malt beverages. The establishment may also include a tasting room and
116	retail space to sell malt beverages produced on the premises along with related retail
117	items and food.

119	Micro-Winery: An establishment that is licensed by the Florida Department of
120	Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco to
121	produce wine. The establishment may also include a tasting room and retail space to

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124	SECTION 3. CODIFICATION. The city clerk and the city attorney shall cause
125	the Code of the City of Orlando, Florida, to be amended as provided by this ordinance
126	and may renumber, re-letter, and rearrange the codified parts of this ordinance if
127	necessary to facilitate the finding of the law.
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129	SECTION 4. SCRIVENER'S ERROR. The city attorney may correct scrivener's
130	errors found in this ordinance by filing a corrected copy of this ordinance with the city
131	clerk.
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133	SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this ordinance or its						
134	application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect						
135	other provisions or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the						
136	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are						
137	severable.
