Fee and Revenue


- Staff is proposing a park impact fee on:
 - New Single Family Residential and
 - \$966 per unit
 - New Multi-Family Residential
 - \$825 per unit
- Estimated Revenue:
 - \$2.2 million annually

Use of Funds

- USE OF FUNDS
 - New Parks and Recreational Capacity
 - Capacity Enhancements to Existing Parks
 - Funds cannot be used for operating expenses

Collection Zones

- The Park Fee will Be Collected in 3 Zones
- Funds must be utilized within the zone they are collected



Exemptions

- Fee is Assessed on Net New Residential
 - Demolitions are Credited

- Affordable Housing Exemption
 - 100% within Districts above LOS
 - 50% within Districts below LOS



- Fee will be assessed beginning:
 - March 1st, 2017
 - A Minimum Foundation Permit is Required
