AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION; DESIGNATING CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY GENERALLY LOCATED NORTH OF E. CENTRAL BLVD., EAST OF LAKE EOLA, SOUTH OF E. WASHINGTON ST., AND WEST OF N. EOLA DR., BEING COMPRISED OF 0.3 ACRES OF LAND, MORE OR LESS, AND ADDRESSED AS 512 E. WASHINGTON ST., AS AN ORLANDO HISTORIC LANDMARK; PROVIDING FINDINGS, PERMIT DISCLAIMER, FOR SEVERABILITY, CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, section 65.720, Code of the City of Orlando, Florida ("Orlando City Code"), provides for the designation of a "site, building, structure[,] or object as an Historic Landmark [] when appropriate documentation demonstrates significance in history, architecture, archeology, engineering[,] or culture and it possesses integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling[,] and association…"; and

WHEREAS, section 65.720, Orlando City Code, further requires that a site, building, structure, or object proposed for designation as an Orlando Historic Landmark demonstrate "[association] with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history", or "[association] with the lives of persons significant in our past", or "[t]hat embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction, or that represents the work of a master, or that possesses high artistic values", or "[t]hat has yielded or may be likely to yield, information important in prehistory or history"; and

WHEREAS, based upon the evidence presented to the City of Orlando Historic Preservation Board (the "HPB") at its regular meeting of May 4, 2016, including the information and analysis contained in the "Staff Report" to the HPB for application case number HPB2016-00057 (entitled "512 East Washington Street"), the HPB found that the real property located at 512 E. Washington Street (hereinafter referred to as the "Eola House") was eligible for designation as an Orlando Historic Landmark under subsection 65.720(a), Orlando City Code, because the property "is associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history," and under subsection 65.720(b), Orlando City Code, because the property "is associated with the lives of persons significant in our past," and also under subsection 65.720(c), Orlando City Code, because the property "embodies the distinctive characteristics of" the Mediterranean Revival style in Orlando; and

WHEREAS, based upon these findings, the HPB recommended to the City Municipal Planning Board (the "MPB") that the City Council of the City of Orlando, Florida (the "Orlando City Council"), designate the Eola House as an Orlando Historic Landmark; and

WHEREAS, based upon the evidence presented to the MPB at its regular meeting of July 19, 2016, including the information and analysis contained in the "Staff Report" to the MPB for application case number HPB2016-00057 (entitled "512 East Washington Street"), the MPB found that the Eola House was eligible for designation as an Orlando Historic Landmark under subsection 65.720(a), Orlando City Code, because the property "is associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history," and under subsection 65.720(b), Orlando City Code, because the property "is associated with the lives of persons significant in our past," and also under subsection 65.720(c), Orlando City Code, because the property "embodies the distinctive characteristics of" the Mediterranean Revival style in Orlando; and

WHEREAS, based upon these findings, the MPB recommended that the Orlando City Council designate the Eola House as an Orlando Historic Landmark; and

WHEREAS, Eola House is a Mediterranean Revival Style historic home built in 1924 and is generally located in Lake Eola Park, north of E. Central boulevard, east of Lake Eola, south of E. Washington Street, and west of N. Eola Drive, being more particularly described by the legal description of the property by metes and bounds attached to this ordinance as **Exhibit A** (the "property"); and

WHEREAS, based upon the findings of the City Historic Preservation Officer, the Historic Preservation Board, the Municipal Planning Board, and the testimony and evidence provided by city staff and the public, the Orlando City Council hereby finds and determines that, in accordance with the criteria provided in section 65.720, Orlando City Code, appropriate documentation has been provided to demonstrate that the property is "significan[t] in history, ...or culture and [] possesses integrity of location, design, setting...feeling[,] and association...", that the property is "associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history," that the property is "associated with the lives of persons significant in our past," and that the property embodies the distinctive characteristics of" the Mediterranean Revival style in Orlando; and

WHEREAS, based upon the findings of the City Historic Preservation Officer, the Historic Preservation Board, the Municipal Planning Board, and the testimony and evidence provided by city staff and the public, the Orlando City Council hereby finds and determines that, in accordance with the criteria provided in section 65.720, Orlando City Code, the property is, in fact "significan[t] in history, ...or culture and [] possesses integrity of location, design, setting...feeling[,] and association...", that the property is "associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history," that the property is "associated with the lives of persons significant in our past," and that the property "embodies the distinctive characteristics of" the Mediterranean Revival style in Orlando; and

WHEREAS, the Orlando City Council hereby finds and determines that this ordinance is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare; and

92 93 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY 94 OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA: 95 96 SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF ORLANDO HISTORIC LANDMARK. In ac-97 cordance with section 65.720, Orlando City Code, the property (including the Eola 98 House located thereon) is hereby designated an Orlando Historic Landmark, and is 99 henceforth subject to all the laws and benefits applicable to said designation. 100 101 SECTION 2. OTHER STATE AND FEDERAL PERMITS. As provided by sub-102 section 166.033(5), Florida Statutes, issuance of a development permit by a municipality 103 does not in any way create any right on the part of an applicant to obtain a permit from a 104 state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the municipality for 105 issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obli-106 gations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a viola-107 tion of state or federal law. In accordance with subsection 166.033(5), Florida Statutes, it 108 is hereby made a condition of this ordinance that all other applicable state or federal 109 permits be obtained before commencement of development work on the property. 110 111 SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this ordinance or its applica-112 tion to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other pro-113 visions or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid 114 provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable. 115 SECTION 4. SCRIVENER'S ERROR. The city attorney may correct scrivener's 116 117 errors found in this ordinance by filing a corrected copy of this ordinance with the city 118 clerk. 119 120 **SECTION 5.
