Invocation

The invocation was given by Vicki O'Grady, Licensed Mental Health Counselor, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Commissioner Tony Ortiz.

Minutes

It was moved by Commissioner Tony Ortiz, seconded by Commissioner Patty Sheehan, and vote carried that the reading of the minutes be waived for the October 10, 2016 Agenda Review and City Council meetings, with minutes approved as written.

Awards/Presentations/Recognitions

Proclaiming October 24, 2016 as "Light Up Rotary to End Polio Now Day"

Mayor Dyer called on Commissioner Stuart who explained the role of Rotary International and Rotary Clubs of District 6980's efforts to help eradicate polio. Mayor Dyer read a proclamation recognizing October 24, 2016 as "Light Up Rotary to End Polio Now Day" in the City of Orlando.

Presenting 2016 Sustainable Florida Best Practice Award for Partnership Development

City Sustainability Director Chris Castro explained that Sustainable Florida is a statewide non-profit organization that advances the vision of sustainability by identifying, supporting and communicating best management practices. Each year Sustainable Florida gives its Best Practices Awards to recognize outstanding sustainability program and policy development, projects and other initiatives. In 2016, the City of Orlando was awarded the Best Practice Award for Partnership Development for its Food Waste Composting programs.

2016 USDA Farmers Market Promotion Program (FMPP) Grant, West Orlando Farm-to-Community Project

Mr. Castro also announced that the City of Orlando has been awarded a \$250,000 grant from the United

States Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Marketing Service Farmer's Market Promotion Program (FMPP) to increase access to local and healthy food options in West Orlando. The grant initiatives include: 1) creating 10-15 "farmlettes" (aka micro-urban farms) in resident front yards, creating a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program based on the Fleet Farming model; 2) launching a Farmer's Market at Orlando City Soccer Club's new stadium in Parramore which will feature foods locally grown in the area; and 3) teaching neighborhood residents about nutrition and healthy cooking in partnership with Hebni Nutrition. Kay Rawlins from Orlando City Soccer Foundation and Caroline Chomanics, Fleet Farming Program Coordinator, both spoke briefly about their organizations' partnerships with the City on this grant.

"Week of the Family" Proclamation

Giorgina Pinedo, Assistant to Director, Office of Community Affairs and Human Relations, introduced Lynn Whitcomb, Chair of the Orange County Week of the Family Committee, who gave a brief overview of the meaningful connections that support and strengthen families. Mayor Dyer read a proclamation recognizing November 5-12, 2016 as the Week of the Family in the City of Orlando.

MAYOR'S UPDATE

Mayor Dyer began his update by announcing that Commissioner Gray's birthday is November 6. The Council and audience sang happy birthday to Commissioner Gray.

MEI Score

Last week, the Human Rights Campaign announced that the City obtained the highest score of 100 on the HRC's 2016 Municipal Equality Index for the third year in a row.

Come Out With Pride New Date

This year's Come Out With Pride events were postponed due to Hurricane Matthew and will now be held on Saturday, November 12, 2016 at Lake Eola Park. The festival starts at 1:00 P.M. and the parade at 5:00 P.M.

Veterans Day Parade

Also on Saturday, November 12, the Mayor's Veterans Advisory Council will host the City of Orlando's 17th annual Veterans Day Parade to honor the courageous men and women of the armed forces. The parade begins at Orange Avenue and Robinson Street in Downtown Orlando at 11:00 A.M. This year's parade is recognizing the 15th anniversary of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. Mayor Dyer invited everyone to attend the parade to show support for all veterans and active duty military and stay for the Pride events.
