# HARRY P. LEU GARDENS BOARD October 26, 2016 Minutes

The Harry P. Leu Gardens Board of Trustees held its regular meeting on Wednesday, October 26, 2016, at Leu Gardens. The meeting was called to order by Michelle Francos, Chair, at 7:55 a.m. announcing a quorum present:

## **MINUTES:**

It was moved by Michael Provenzale and seconded by Jennifer Lombardo to approve the September 28, 2016 Harry P. Leu Board minutes. There was no discussion. The minutes were approved by all as presented.

#### ATTENDANCE, REVENUE AND EXPENSE REPORTS:

Robert Bowden reported on September 2016 Leu Attendance. The 2015-16 fiscal year had record breaking attendance of 162,114 since fiscal year 2008-09 attendance of 154,303. Mr. Bowden noted that paid garden admission was the highest ever with 57,294 people.

It was moved by Isaiah Cottle and seconded by Lorelei Anderson-Francis to approve Leu's September 2016 Attendance, report. There was no further discussion. It was approved by all as presented.

## Camara Williams arrived at 7:59 a.m.

Mr. Bowden updated the Board of the record breaking revenue of \$1,298,429. It was noted that Paid Admissions of \$491,712 and Memberships of \$218,544 broke records and the Gift Shop Resales of \$141,495 nearly matched its sales record since 1999.

Discussion continued on expenses. Mr. Bowden and Keri Byrum discussed the next fiscal year expenses with the Board. The Gardens will be receiving three replacement golf carts this fiscal year.

It was moved by Lorelei Anderson-Francis and seconded by Camara Williams to approve Leu's September 2016 Revenue and Expense reports. There was no further discussion. It was approved by all as presented.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Hearing no public comment, the meeting proceeded.

## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Mr. Bowden introduced Eric Sondgeroth, Leu Gardens' new Horticultural Manager to the Board.

## Eric Sondgeroth left at 8:15 a.m.

Linda Schmidt, Education Supervisor, after 20 years at the Gardens, will be retiring December 2016.

Mr. Bowden will meet with Paul Taylor, one of the previous landscape designers, for the design of the trellis in the former Citrus Grove.

The camellias purchased through the Friends of Leu Gardens will be planted soon.

## HORTICULTURE: Brendan O'Connor reported from Eric Sondgeroth,

The team did a great job with the clean up from Hurricane Matthew. Overall the Gardens fared well with minimal impact.

The Horticulture staff performed some maintenance around the floral clock. The plant material in the clock was trimmed and re-mulched. We will also be cleaning the groundcover for a more manicured appearance.

Work continues in the Rose Garden with the replacement of roses and upgrading the irrigation system. The new irrigation will allow for an even distribution of water which will be more efficient.

The Education Department is busy scheduling for the upcoming Dinosaur tours. During the months of January to April 2017, regular tours will be available in addition to children's tours focusing on dinosaurs. The tour will include information on each dinosaur, the unique, fun facts as well as the prehistoric plants we have growing in the Gardens. There are 27 dinosaur tours scheduled so far.

There were fewer classes this month, but Mr. Bowden's "Fall and Winter Vegetable" class had 37 participants. Ms. Schmidt is currently working on the winter quarter class schedule and hopes to include some dinosaur, fossils and prehistoric plant classes.
