AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY'S GROWTH MANAGEMENT PLAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CITY'S 2017 WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES WORK PLAN; AMENDING FIGURES PW-1, PW-2 AND PW-3 OF THE POTABLE WATER ELEMENT: AMENDING THE POLICIES, GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE POTABLE WATER ELEMENT, THE WASTEWATER ELEMENT, THE STORMWATER AND AQUIFER RECHARGE ELEMENT, THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL COORDINATION ELEMENT, AND CONSERVATION **ELEMENT**; **PROVIDING** SEVERABILITY, CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Orlando, Florida (the "Orlando City Council"), originally adopted the City's Growth Management Plan (the "GMP") on August 12, 1991 (Orlando City Clerk documentary #25002), and has periodically updated and amended the GMP since that time; and

WHEREAS, the GMP is the City's comprehensive plan for purposes of the Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act; and

WHEREAS, water supply planning in central Florida is jointly conducted through the Central Florida Water Initiative, which is comprised of the South Florida Water Management District, the St. Johns River Water Management District, the Southwest Florida Water Management District, and other pertinent agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Central Florida Water Initiative generated a regional water supply plan for central Florida; and

WHEREAS, the St. Johns River Water Management District approved the Central Florida Water Initiative Regional Water Supply Plan on November 10, 2015, and

WHEREAS, the South Florida Water Management District approved the Central Florida Water Initiative Regional Water Supply Plan on November 12, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Southwest Florida Water Management District approved the Central Florida Water Initiative Regional Water Supply Plan on November 17, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature requires the City to update its Water Supply Facilities Work Plan within 18 months of the adoption of an update to the Central Florida Regional Water Supply Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to adopt the following GMP amendments to address the updated Central Florida Regional Water Supply Plan, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

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**SECTION 1.** Figure PW-1 of the Potable Water Element of the GMP is hereby amended, replaced and superseded in its entirety by "Exhibit A" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

**SECTION 2.** Figure PW-2 of the Potable Water Element of the GMP is hereby amended, replaced and superseded in its entirety by "Exhibit B" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

**SECTION 3.** Figure PW-3 of the Potable Water Element of the GMP is hereby amended, replaced and superseded in its entirety by "Exhibit C" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

**SECTION 4.** The policies and objectives of the Potable Water Element of the GMP are hereby amended as follows:

Policy 1.1.2 OUC shall periodically <u>monitor and inspect its potable water</u> wells to ensure they are in good repair and are not acting as conduits to <u>potentially contaminated water</u>. inspect its potable water well casings to ensure they are in good repair and are not acting as conduits to potentially contaminated water.

Objective 1.2 <u>In addition to the significant reduction in per capita demand already achieved since 2004, Tthe City shall reduce total per capita potable water demand by an additional 7 3 percent between 200417 to 201520, and an additional 4 percent by 202040.</u>

Policy 1.2.1 In order to conserve potable water supplies throughout the planning period, the City <u>Landscaping Code and its water conservation</u> requirements shall <u>apply.</u> maintain regulations that require water reduction devices in new development, require Xeriscaping for all development except one and two family building sites, and decrease use of potable water supplies for nonpotable water uses.

The City shall continue to improve conservation rates by periodically updating the Building Code and Land Development Code to incorporate advances in water conservation practices.

Policy 1.2.3 The City shall reduce the use of potable water for irrigation purposes throughout the planning period by adopting and enforcing regulations that require property owners in the reclaimed water service area to connect to the reclaimed water network where available feasible. When determining reclaimed water feasibility the availability of reclaimed water and the net reduction in potable water use shall be considered (when potable water saved is greater than potable water flushing for water quality).

Policy 1.2.8 The City shall review and consider adopting the SJRWMD Model Landscape Water Management Ordinance by January 1, 2009. (Reserved)

Policy 1.2.9 OUC shall promote water conservation through television and radio advertising, website information and other outreach efforts multi-media outreach activities and supporting educational efforts, including television and radio advertising, website information and other outreach initiatives.

Objective 1.3 The City shall cooperate in implementing SJRWMD's District Water Supply Plan and SFWMD's Kissimmee Basin Water Supply Plan the Central Florida Water Initiative Water Regional Water Supply Plan through normal regular OUC/Water Management District coordination and jurisdictional authority, throughout the planning period and through adoption of the City's Water Supply Facilities Work Plan. The City shall adopt and maintain the Water Supply Facilities Work Plan for at least a 10-year planning period. The Water Supply Facilities Work Plan, dated July 7, 2008 adoption date to be inserted is herein adopted, by reference. The Water Supply Facilities Work Plan provides data and analysis necessary to support the goals, objectives and policies in this element. A 10-year schedule of water supply projects needed to meet demand in the Plan is provided in Figure PW-3. Supporting data and analysis may be attached as appendices to the Water Supply Facilities Work Plan, and updated from time to time, without the necessity of an amendment to the Growth Management Plan.

Policy 1.3.1 The City shall, through the mandated operating procedures of the Orlando Utilities Commission, and through adoption of the City's Water Supply Facilities Work Plan, cooperate in implementing the State's Water Supply Plan, the SJRWMD Water Supply Plan and SFWMD Water Supply Plan and the regional Central Florida Water Initiative Regional Water Supply Plan.

Policy 1.3.2 The City shall update its Water Supply Facilities Work Plan within eighteen months after the adoption of the SFWMD's Kissimmee Basin Water Supply Plan, or the SJRWMD's District Water Supply Plan, whichever is adopted last Central Florida Water Initiative Regional Water Supply Plan, pursuant to the adoption schedule of the South Florida Water Management District, the St. Johns River Water Management District and the Southwest Florida Water Management District.

Policy 1.8.1 In order to conserve potable water supplies throughout the planning period, the City shall maintain <u>Landscaping Code</u> regulations that require water reduction devices in new development, require Xeriscaping for all development except for one and two family building sites, and decrease use of potable water supplies for non-potable water uses.
