RESOLUTION
A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO,
FLORIDA, RECOMMENDING THAT AMERICAN TOURS INTERNATIONAL,
LLC BE APPROVED AS A QUALIFED TARGET INDUSTRY BUSINESS
PURSUANT TO SECTION 288.106, FLORIDA STATUTES, AND PLEDGING
LOCAL FINANCIAL SUPPORT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 288.106,
FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CORRECTION OF
SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
Whereas, in 1994, the Florida Legislature passed legislation establishing a
"Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program" ("QTI Program") to encourage the
creation of new high wage job opportunities in the State of Florida by providing tax
refunds to qualified target industries; and
Whereas, to qualify for QTI Program incentives, Florida law requires a resolution
from the governing board of the local government recommending that a business be
approved as a qualified target industry business; and
Whereas, the City Council of the City of Orlando, Florida wishes to recommend
that American Tours International, LLC ("ATI") be approved by the Division of Strategic
Business Development of the State of Florida as a qualified target industry business; and
Whereas, ATI is a targeted industry proposing to create high wage job
opportunities in an industry highly coveted by other states and nations; and

1 Whereas, ATI falls within one of the high-impact sectors designated under 2 Florida Statute 288.108, and is eligible to apply for the Qualified Target Industry Tax 3 Refund with a High Impact Sector Bonus, pursuant to Florida Statute 288.106; and 4 Whereas, ATI is considering adding an East Coast corporate headquarters in the 5 City of Orlando and thereby adding forty seven (47) new jobs to the area; and 6 Whereas, ATI will commit to pay an average wage of \$50,472.00, which is 115% 7 of the 2014 Orange County Average Annual Wage; and 8 Whereas, ATI has applied to the Office of the Governor, Division of Strategic 9 Business Development for approval as a QTI Program participant; and 10 Whereas, competition for ATI exists outside the State of Florida, and financial 11 incentives are necessary to ensure that the company expands in the City of Orlando rather 12 than elsewhere; and 13 **NOW, THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Orlando, 14 Florida, as follows: 15 1. The City Council of the City of Orlando, Florida, does hereby recommend 16 that ATI be approved as a qualified target industry business as described by section 17 288.106, Florida Statutes. 18 2. In accordance with the requirements of section 288.106, Florida Statutes, 19 and subject to the terms of this resolution, the City of Orlando pledges an amount not to 20 exceed Forty Seven Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$47,000.00), which represents the 21 necessary commitment of local financial support for this qualified target industry 22 business. Such funds shall be payable to the Florida Economic Development Trust Fund,

with the stipulation that these funds are intended to represent the local participation element of section 288.106, Florida Statutes.

3. The pledge of funds pursuant to this resolution is contingent upon ATI being qualified by the State of Florida as a QTI Program participant and future budget appropriations by the Orlando City Council. The City of Orlando pledges local financial support in the amount of Twenty Eight Thousand Two Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$28,200.00) for the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program and Fourteen Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$14,800.00) for the High Impact Sector Bonus for a total amount of Forty Seven Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$47,000.00) in the following amounts:

In the event that ATI is approved by the State of Florida for tax refunds in an amount less than the estimated amount, the total local financial support to be paid by the City shall be proportionately reduced so that the total tax refund awarded to ATI by the City will not exceed the actual percentage amount that was awarded by the City of the total tax refund awarded to ATI pursuant to the QTI Program.
- 5. In the event that ATI is approved by the State of Florida to exercise its option for a one-year extension for job creation, the total local financial support to be

1	paid by the City shall be reduced by five percent (5%) in accordance by the QTI					
2	Agreement between ATI and the State of Florida.					
3	6. This resolution takes effect immediately upon passage.
