Subject: Award of IFB 17-0017, Processing and Disposal of Solid Waste

Please ask City Council to award items 1-5 of this bid to both qualified bidders as primary contractors.

The disposal/processing locations of the two bidders are several miles apart and a SW truck costs over \$120 per hour to operate. Selecting the disposal site based on a combination of driving distance and disposal fee is the most cost effective decision point. For example, MSW (garbage) collected in Metro West should be delivered to the WMI site on McLeod Rd and not the much longer drive to Progressive Waste in Taft. The savings for a typical load of would be \$80 in driving time. However the savings is reversed if the load originates in Lee Vista on SR 436.

Once the contract has been awarded by Council and executed, SWMD staff will review the typical origination points of loads of each type of waste, calculate the total cost of delivery expense and disposal fee, and direct City refuse trucks to the most economical location.
