- **WHEREAS,** Haitian Heritage Month includes traditions like Labor and Agriculture Day, Teacher's Day, Haitian Flag Day, University Day and Mother's Day; and
- **WHEREAS,** the City of Orlando takes great pride in the diversity of people, cultures and traditions represented by its residents; and
- WHEREAS, Orlando is enriched by the significant and lasting contributions of its residents of Haitian heritage and recognizes their achievements and success in all aspects of society, including business, education, law, the arts and sciences; and
- **WHEREAS**, the residents of the City of Orlando join Minister-Counsellor Pierre Max Charles, the new General Consulate of the Republic of Haiti in Orlando, and the Haitian community in celebrating the rich history and culture of the Republic of Haiti;

**NOW, THEREFORE, WE,** Buddy Dyer, Mayor of the City of Orlando, and Samuel B. Ings, District 6 City Commissioner, hereby do proclaim May 2017, as

"Haitian Heritage Cultural Month"
