#### **MINUTES:**

## ATTENDANCE, REVENUE AND EXPENSE REPORTS:

Robert Bowden reported on February 2017 Leu Attendance.

Overall attendance for February 2017 was higher than last year by 14,000 visitors, with paid garden admission higher than last year by 9,400 visitors.

It was moved by Michelle Francos and seconded by Michael Provenzale to approve Leu's February 2017 Attendance reports. There was no discussion. It was approved by all as presented.

The Board discussed Leu's February 2017 revenue and expenses. It was clarified by Antoinette Ashman that February 2017 revenues were not all reflected in the revenue report, but would be recorded in March 2017 revenues.

It was moved by Michael Provenzale and seconded by Michelle Francos to approve Leu's February 2017 Revenue and Expense reports. There was no discussion. It was approved by all as presented.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Hearing no public comment, the meeting proceeded.

## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Mr. Bowden recognized and thanked Michelle Francos for her years of service on the board.

Mr. Bowden gave best wishes to Keri Byrum in her new endeavors as she resigned from the City of Orlando and relocating to Iowa.

## **DEPARTMENT REPORTS:**

HORTICULTURE: Michelle Francos reported from Eric Sondgeroth,

The Horticulture staff has completed cut backs in the Rose Garden.

The placement of pine straw in areas has started in the gardens and around the Garden House.

Work continues in the former Citrus Grove area to prep for new plantings and the new paver area is complete.

A declining Laurel Oak tree was removed at the Leu House Museum.

The Floral Clock gears were taken to an Orlando machine shop for repair. We hope to have it back soon.

Part of a Live Oak fell near the rain shelter in the north woods. The debris on the pathway has been cleared but the pathway is closed until the remaining part of the tree can be removed.

The staff worked on preparing the gardens for the annual Plant Sale.

The gardens received a donation of 300 Sun Rosa roses that will be installed at the center fountain in the Rose Garden.

The annual Envirothon was held on February 2 with 220 students and staff. The board viewed pictures of the Envirothon.
