Exhibit B Policies From City of Orlando Growth Management Plan, Future Land Use Element Adopted February 2, 2009

- Policy S.12.7 This Subarea Policy shall apply to all property located within the area generally bound by the East-West Expressway, South Orange Avenue, Michigan Street and I-4 (the "South Downtown Subarea").
 - (a) South Downtown Subarea Purpose. This Subarea, known as the South Downtown Area, is intended to be a vibrant, recognizable, mixed-use, multi-modal neighborhood that thrives on the synergies afforded by the continued growth of the Orlando Health campus and adjacent medicalrelated uses.
 - (b) South Downtown Vision Plan. To encourage the diverse, efficient and intensive use of land within the South Downtown Subarea, the City prepared a South Downtown Vision Plan (the "Vision Plan") dated * September 2008. The Vision Plan provided recommendations
 - concerning the following:

VISION PLAN

FUTURE LAND USE STRATEGY

Recommended firture land use modifications include

- SOUTH DOWNTOWN SUBAREA POLICY
- Allow residential uses in the Industrial Putate Land Use designation up to a maximum of 40 dwelling units per acte.
- Support the formation of an advisory group to address issues of districtwide concern.
- Adopt a special plan zoning overlay to address development gasdelines and design standards.
- KALEY SUBAREA POLICY


Allow a range of uses and density/intensity bottness at Kaley Street and Division Avenue, providing a maximum intensity of a 2.0 EA.R. and/or a maximum density of 100 dwelling units per acre.

TRANSIT STATION SUBAREA POLICY #1

Allow a range of uses and density/intensity bonuses within 1/4 mile radius of the proposed Annusk/Orlando Health Commuter Rail Station, providing a maximum intensity of 3.0 EA.R. and/ or a manimum density of 100 dwelling units per acts.

TRANSIT STATION SUBAREA POLICY #2

Allow a range of uses and density/intensity bonnes within 1/2 trille radius of the proposed Anrmk/Orlando Health Communer Rail Station, providing a maximum intensity of 1.6 EA.B. and/ or a maximum density 100 dwelling units per icre.







City Context

- Past Planning efforts such as the Orange-Michigan Vision Plan and Overlay Zoning Ordinance have helped guide new development, including:
 - street-front buildings,
 - parking in the back,
 - active ground floor uses,
 - increased sidewalk widths
 - ...and other enhancements.
- The momentum of the SODO Main Street and Downtown South have also helped make Orange Avenue a priority for enhancement for both the City and FDOT.









Corridor Plans for Downtown South

- Key Drivers (Call to Action!):
 - FDOT is preparing to enhance Orange Avenue from Pineloch to Lucerne.
 - <u>City + DSNID will partner for</u> <u>increased streetscape treatments</u>
 - South Downtown Main Street Activity
 - Quality new investment / development activity is happening as we speak!



Planned FDOT work includes narrower lanes, increased sidewalks, 'bulb-outs' around on-street parking, enhanced crosswalks, transit stops.

Not Included by FDOT: special trees, lighting, overhead powerline burial, special pavements, art + sustainability




State and Local Partnerships

Secretary Jim Boxold said while speaking at the Florida Chamber of Commerce Future of Florida Forum in Orlando.

"...this is accomplished by "context based road design," which actually means that the department rejects a one-size fits all approach to road design.

We're going to built the right street, in the right place, to serve the right function," he said, adding that this represented "a major shift in thinking at Florida DOT."

How can we celebrate the diversity within the district?

Can the streetscape improvements contribute toward defining a Community?

We would like to get feed back on the approaches to curating a palette of furnishings, signs, and gateways that reflect the culture and character of the district.
