Program Overview

In this short-term training program, residents enrolled will learn a variety of basic construction skills that are required for many entry-level positions in the field of building construction. The demand for skilled workers continues to grow with over 9 billion dollars of construction projects in process and planned for the Central Florida area within the next few years. The career opportunities are diverse and the potential to work in a high wage position is available for residents interested in this industry. <u>Note:</u> This program does not require a high school diploma or GED to enroll.

Key Facts About a Career in Construction

• Must be willing to work outside in the Florida weather.

• Must be currently <u>drug free</u>, able to lift 80 pounds unassisted, and carry objects of 50 pounds or less routinely.

• Average wages for entry-level positions are \$12 to \$14 per hour.

• Future workforce needs are great (1.5 million workers).

• Promotional opportunities exist in a variety of areas of construction (concrete, heavy equipment, vertical, & highway construction).

• Background tolerant industry.

Upon completion, participants will test to earn the following credentials:

- 72.5 C.E.U's with NCCER (National Center for Construction Education and Research).
- Maintenance of Traffic Intermediate (MOT/FDOT)
- OSHA 10 hour card (OSHA 29, CFR 1926)
- CPR card
- First Aid certification
- Three college credits awarded, if credentials are earned, toward an Associate of Science Degree in Building Construction Technology.
