

## CITY OF ORLANDO - OFFICE OF THE MAYOR

**WHEREAS,** the City of Orlando Hispanic Office for Local Assistance started as a pilot program in 2004 in partnership with a local community organization; and

WHEREAS, on April 3, 2006, the City of Orlando officially opened HOLA at the Engelwood Neighborhood Center and it was later moved to its current location at 595 North Primrose Drive; and

whereas, the mission of HOLA is "to connect the residents, families, businesses and newcomers to the City of Orlando with its city, government agencies, community-based organizations and professional entities with information, resources and tools necessary to strengthen the quality of life of its residents;" and

**WHEREAS,** with the collaboration of approximately 100 community organizations, including some with in-house services, HOLA has expanded its services to meet the needs of the city's growing Hispanic population; and

WHEREAS, more than 175,000 citizens have been served through visits, calls and e-mails over the past 15 years; and following Hurricane Maria, HOLA welcomed and assisted more than 6,000 people in the first six months after the storm; and

WHEREAS, HOLA has assisted and will continue to assist residents and the thousands of newcomers from around the world who come to Orlando to pursue a better quality of life;
