A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLANDO, FLORIDA, RELATING TO ORLANDO'S 2030 ELECTRIC MOBILITY ROADMAP; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, REPEAL OF CONFLICTING RESOLUTIONS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, since 2007, the City of Orlando, through Mayor Buddy Dyer's Green Works Orlando initiative, has been working to make Orlando the most sustainable city in the Southeast, by prioritizing efforts to improve quality of life and wellbeing of our residents, preserve and protect natural resources, promote environmental stewardship in the community, and develop a robust green economic development strategy, of which, sustainable, healthy and affordable mobility is essential; and

WHEREAS, the Orlando City Council recognizes that in order for the City to create mobility opportunities that embrace emerging technologies, reduce emissions that harm public health, bolster climate change resilience, and increase access and affordability for our disadvantaged communities, the City and community partners must promote policies, programs, and practices that advance clean mobility options for all; and

WHEREAS, in January 2021, the City, in partnership with Bloomberg Philanthropies' American Cities Climate Challenge, embarked on a journey to create a unified vision and roadmap for the future of electric-powered mobility (E-mobility) in Orlando by launching the Orlando E-Mobility Task Force; and

WHEREAS, the Taskforce was composed of primary stakeholders in transportation and mobility such as City of Orlando, Orange County, MetroPlan Orlando, Orlando Utilities Commission, Duke Energy, LYNX, Central Florida Expressway, Natural Resources Defense Council, Delivery Associates, EVHybridNoire, Electrification Coalition, and others; and

WHEREAS, the City facilitated a series of 5 workshops through 2021, with the purpose of creating and resulting in Orlando's 2030 Electric Mobility Roadmap. The Task Force recognized the importance of 4 main goals: 1) Provide equitable and affordable access to e-mobility; 2) Accelerate EV adoption in multiple transportation sectors; 3) Develop a robust charging ecosystem; and 4) Advance multimodal e-mobility options; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Orlando, Florida, hereby finds this resolution and Orlando's 2030 Electric Mobility Roadmap to be in the best interests of the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Orlando; and
